All Good Children Follow-up Questions:

Form:

- 1. Give two possible reasons why this story is written in the present tense.
- 2. Find three metaphors Max uses in his narration. Do they have anything in common? Can you find any examples of Max seeing like an artist?
- 3. Some of the slang words used in Max's school are not used in the same way today, e.g., recall, defective, unit, bleeds, premium. Do you think they have significance? Do you think current slang (peace, word, cool, dude) has a deeper meaning?
- 4. Rewrite one scene from the book (e.g., the opening scene in the airport or a fight scene) from the perspective of another character. Does the meaning of the scene change with the changing perspective? Does Max's personality seem to change?
- 5. Would Max be more or less likeable if his story were told from another point of view? Describe him from Ally's perspective and Mr. Graham's. Is he the same kid he feels himself to be? Would other people describe you the way you feel yourself to be?
- 6. Most readers like Xavier. Do you think he would be so likeable if the story were told in third person? Why do you think Max feels so close to him?

- 7. Consider the effects of Nesting on aggressive children like Austin and Tyler, or on Mrs. Connors' depressed elderly patients. Do you think there is some valid use for it?
- 8. Do you think Nesting the elite children of New Middletown matters much, considering the poor people outside the city walls? How would a kid from the carpark tell this story?
- 9. Do you think parents would relate to children differently if they spent great sums of money on their conception and chose which embryo should grow into their baby?
- 10. Are the people in New Middletown rich compared to you? What makes them seem wealthy? Would you like to live in New Middletown before they had Nesting?
- 11. Why do you think so many books and movies show some poor kid humiliated by a mean dad on a football field? What do you think about a book called *All Good Parents*? Would you be tempted to Nest your parents?
- 12. If you painted a tent like Max's, what would yours have inside?
